APPLYING FOR ADMISSION

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A Bachelor's degree from an institution regarded as a standard by the University and a regional accrediting agency
- A minimum GPA of 3.0 (4.0 scale) over the last 60 hours of undergraduate degree coursework
- Official GRE Test Scores (TCU code 6820): Typically, successful applicants have a Verbal GRE score of at least 155, a Quantitative GRE score of 145, and an Analytical Writing GRE score of 4.0, although other criteria for admission are considered
- International students are required to also submit official TOEFL scores. Typically, successful applicants have a TOEFL total score of 79-80 (Internet-based), 213 (computer-based), or 550 (paper-based)
- Professional statement of interest
- Three letters of recommendation from former faculty members, sent to the Director of Graduate Studies

- This will include payment of the application fee, completion of an essay question, and submission of three letters of recommendation.
- Have two complete, official transcripts mailed from the Registrar's Office of each institution attended since high school.
- Submit official GRE scores to TCU
- Submit official TOEFL scores (for international students)
- Submit resume or curriculum vitae
- Deadline: February 15th each year for fall admissions only
